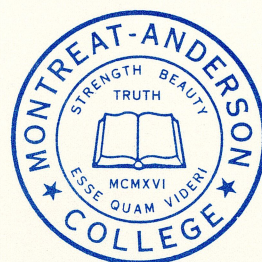

THE COLLEGE SEAL

The seal of Montreat-Anderson College is composed of concentric circles surrounding the open book of learning and the Word of God. The words "Montreat-Anderson College" encompass the ideals of strength, beauty, and truth above the Latin motto meaning "to be rather than to seem." The date of the founding of the College, 1916, completes the emblem.



THE MACE AND THE BANNER

The College mace symbolizes the authority of the President and is present in all official College convocations. The Montreat-Anderson mace is of walnut and silver, representing the simplicity and strength of the Cross of Christ, the open Bible, and the lamp of knowledge, transcendent over the seal of the College. The Celtic cross, the open Bible, and the word TRUTH represent the focus of Montreat-Anderson College.

Lucille Belk Armistead

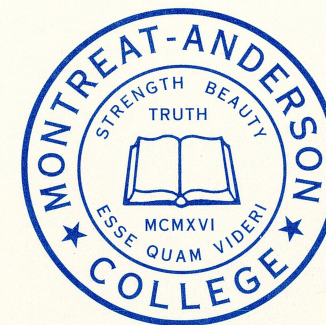
Lucille Belk (Armistead) taught at Montreat Normal School from 1922-25, following her graduation from Chicora College in Charlotte (now Queens). In 1923, she wrote the Alma Mater which is still used by the college.

In 1927, she married the Reverend Humphrey Armistead. For the next sixteen years the Armisteads lived in Franklin, Tennessee. They returned to Montreat in 1943, and Mrs. Armistead resumed her teaching at the Normal School until it closed in 1954. The Armisteads moved to Florida in 1955.

Mrs. Armistead died on April 5th at the age of 94, in Winter Park, Florida. We give thanks today for her life and contributions to Montreat-Anderson College.
