THE COLLEGE SEAL

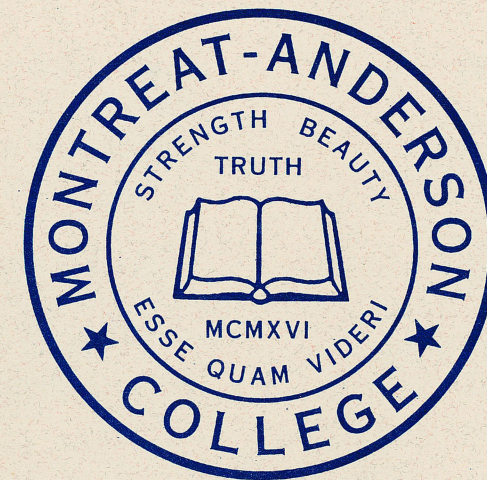
The seal of Montreat-Anderson College is composed of concentric circles surrounding the open book of learning and the Word of God. The words "Montreat-Anderson College" encompass the ideals of strength, beauty, and truth above the Latin motto meaning "to be rather than to seem." The date of the founding of the College, 1916, completes the emblem.

THE MACE AND THE BANNER

The College mace symbolizes the authority of the President and is present in all official College convocations. The Montreat-Anderson mace is of walnut and silver, representing the simplicity and strength of the Cross of Christ, the open Bible, and the lamp of knowledge, transcendent over the seal of the College. The Celtic cross, the open Bible, and the word TRUTH on the banner represent the focus of Montreat-Anderson College.

HONORARY DEGREES

William R. Bright

Dr. William R. Bright is the founder and president of Campus Crusade for Christ International. He is a graduate of Northeastern State University in Oklahoma with graduate studies at Princeton and Fuller seminaries. He serves as chairman of the Year of the Bible Foundation. Among his many ministries are a weekly television program, *Keys to Dynamic Living*, and a daily radio program. Dr. Bright has authored numerous books, pamphlets, and articles. Because of the magnitude of his work, Dr. Bright is widely recognized as one of the most influential and accomplished Christian leaders of the world. In 1982, he spoke at the dedication of Montreat-Anderson's Newell Athletic Field.

Calvin Thielman

Dr. Calvin Thielman is a graduate of West Texas State University and Columbia Theological Seminary, with post-graduate study at New College, the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. He has been pastor of the Montreat Presbyterian Church since 1962 and served as chaplain of Montreat-Anderson College from 1962 to 1992. Dr. Thielman served as a research assistant to Dr. Billy Graham, and has traveled extensively in Europe, Asia and Africa with Dr. Graham. He also served as a special advisor to President Lyndon Johnson during the war in Vietnam, reporting to the President on situations in various areas of the world.
