Dr. Silas Vaughn served as President of Montreat College 1972-1991. Prior to his tenure at Montreat, he served in other administrative capacities at UNC-Charlotte and St. Andrews Presbyterian College. Dr. Vaughn is currently the Chairman of the State of North Carolina Advisory Committee on Higher Education Facilities Utilization, and President of the Bruised Reed Foundation, which supports cancer research and treatment in Korea. He is also a member of the Board of the Medical Benevolence Foundation, a ministry of the Presbyterian Church (USA). He has served on the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Association of Independent Colleges and Universities and on the American Council of Education, as well as holding offices in the Boy Scouts of America and Rotary Club.

Dr. Vaughn and his wife Catherine have traveled extensively, serving as mission volunteers and in consulting roles. They have two sons and four grandchildren.



THE COLLEGE SEAL

The seal of Montreat College is composed of concentric circles surrounding the open book of learning and the Word of God. The words "Montreat College" encompass the ideals of strength, beauty, and truth above the Latin motto meaning "to be rather than to seem." The date of the founding of the College, 1916, completes the emblem.

THE MACE AND THE BANNER

The College mace symbolizes the authority of the President and is present in all official College convocations. The Montreat mace is of walnut and silver, representing the simplicity and strength of the Cross of Christ, the open Bible, and the lamp of knowledge, transcendent over the seal of the College. The College banner features an arched window opening onto the mountains, framing heaven and the College's Christ-centered education; the globe atop it represents the worldwide scope provided by education and the development of a Christian worldview based upon the Bible's teaching. The books represent the beauty and strength of scholarship and the variety of disciplines offered by the College. The candle embodies the illumination that education and faith bring to the individual and the world.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER & HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

W. Franklin Graham III

Franklin Graham, who graduated from Montreat College in 1974 with an associate's degree, was elected to the board of Samaritan's Purse in 1978, and a year later was named president. The Billy Graham Evangelistic Association appointed Franklin Graham CEO in 2000 and president of the organization in 2001. He has served as first vice-chairman of the BGEA since 1995. Similar to his father's famous crusades, Franklin Graham holds three-day evangelistic events called Festivals worldwide; he has recently held two Festivals in Australia, and the next one will be in Paraguay.

In 1974, the same year he graduated from Montreat College, Mr. Graham married Jane Austin Cunningham. Mrs. Graham is on the Board of Trustees of Montreat College. The Grahams have four children and reside in Boone, NC. Mr. Graham is the son of evangelist Billy Graham and Ruth Bell Graham. The Graham family has a long association with Montreat College; Ruth Bell Graham served as a trustee from 1972 to 1981, and she now holds the title of trustee emerita.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

S. Elliot Belcher, Jr.

Elliot Belcher was a founding director of the Montreat-Anderson College Foundation, serving as chairman from the foundation's inception in 1982 until his retirement from the board in October of 1993. He served as an active member of the Montreat College Board of Trustees from 1976 until 1993, when he was unanimously elected trustee emeritus. In the 1980s Mr. Belcher served as chairman of the very successful Decade of the Student capital campaign during which the Newell Athletic Field and W. H. Belk Campus Center were completed. Mr. Belcher has served on the boards of trustees for Palmer Home in Columbus, MS; Reformed Theological Seminary; Southeastern Bible College; and LeTourneau University; and he has served on the Board of Directors of Campus Crusade for Christ International in Orlando, FL, since 1970. He was chairman of the board of Southern United Life Insurance Company and has been the director of several banks in Alabama. Mr. Belcher and his late wife Jeannette Steele Belcher had two sons and two grandchildren. He and his wife Louise Robertson Belcher reside in Brent, AL.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic regalia worn by the faculty are based upon costumes used in fourteenth and fifteenth century universities, particularly Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England. This style of academic dress has been used in the United States since colonial times, and it was standardized by an intercollegiate code in 1895. The doctor gown is distinguished by three velvet stripes on the bell-shaped sleeves, while the master gown's sleeves are oblong. The hood was originally a practical element of dress, but evolved into a purely ornamental article, draped over the shoulder and down the back. The doctor hood extends longer than the master hood. The two colors in the satin lining of the hood are those authorized by the college or university, and the color of the velvet border indicates the degree earned as follows:
