HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Mrs. Virginia M. Snoddy

Virginia M. Snoddy and her family have been long-time supporters of Montreat College and its mission in Christ-centered higher education. Her late husband, Marcus F. Snoddy, served on the Board of Trustees from 1980 to 1993. Mrs. Snoddy is a member of the Galax Society, and her son, Marcus F. Snoddy, Jr., and his wife, Lisa, currently serve as members of the Montreat College Board of Visitors. Her son, Marcus, is also a 1980 graduate of Montreat College and received the 2009 Distinguished Alumni Service Award. Mrs. Snoddy has three grandchildren currently attending Montreat College. Mrs. Snoddy and her husband, along with Montreat College President Emeritus, Silas Vaughn, were the inspiration behind the Chapel of the Prodigal on the Montreat campus, helping the College envision the building of this landmark facility around the Ben Long fresco of the prodigal son.

THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The line of march for the procession follows academic protocol and historical tradition. At today’s ceremony, the academic procession begins with the commencement marshal carrying the College banner and with the longest-serving faculty member bearing the mace. Proceeding next are the candidates for graduation and then, the members of the faculty and President’s Cabinet. At the end of the processional is the platform party, including the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, honored guests, invited speakers, and the President who presides over the ceremony. The line of march is reversed for the recessional.

THE COLLEGE SEAL

The seal of Montreat College is composed of concentric circles surrounding the open book of learning and the Word of God. The words “Montreat College” encompass the ideals of strength, beauty, and truth above the Latin motto meaning “to be rather than to seem.” The date of the founding of the College, 1916, completes the emblem.

THE MACE AND THE BANNER

The College mace symbolizes the authority of the President and is present in all official College ceremonies. The Montreat mace is of walnut and silver, representing the simplicity and strength of the Cross of Christ, the open Bible, and the lamp of knowledge, transcendent over the seal of the College. The College banner features an arched window opening onto the mountains, framing heaven and the College’s Christ-centered education; the globe atop represents the worldwide scope provided by education and the development of a Christian worldview based upon the Bible’s teaching. The books represent the beauty and strength of scholarship and the variety of disciplines offered by the College. The candle embodies the illumination that education and faith bring to the individual and the world.

THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic regalia worn by the faculty are based upon costumes used in fourteenth and fifteenth century universities, particularly Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England. This style of academic dress has been used in the United States since colonial times, and it was standardized by an intercollegiate code in 1895. The doctoral gown is distinguished by three velvet stripes on the bell-shaped sleeves, while the master gown’s sleeves are oblong. The hood was originally a practical element of dress, but it evolved into a purely ornamental article, draped over the shoulder and down the back. The doctoral hood extends longer than the master hood. The two colors in the satin lining of the hood are those authorized by the college or university, and the color of the velvet border indicates the degree earned as follows:

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI SERVICE AWARD RECIPIENTS

School of Arts and Sciences – Jane Bachman Lumb (’48)

Jane Lumb graduated from Montreat College in 1948 and went on to earn a Master’s degree in Education at Syracuse University. Called to teach, she has impacted lives of countless students in and out of the classrooms from seventh grade through college. Driven to serve, Jane has consistently demonstrated selflessness as an advisor, volunteer, friend, and leader in schools, church, and her community. Chosen as a child of God, she has modeled Christlikeness to her students, family, neighbors, and the world. Next to her photo in the 1948 *Sun Dial*, the following is written: “That inexhaustible good nature, which is the most precious gift of Heaven, spreading itself like oil over the troubled sea of thought, and keeping the mind smooth and equable in the roughest weather.” Those who know Jane say that she is still precious and continues to have a calming effect on others.

School of Professional and Adult Studies – Kathy Penland Haney (’99, ’03, ’06)

Kathy Haney earned her Associate’s degree (’99), Bachelor’s degree (’03), and Master’s degree (’06) from the Montreat College School of Professional and Adult Studies. As a Montreat student, Kathy faithfully served her cohort as class representative and ensured team academic research was always properly documented. She was frequently called upon to be her cohort’s spokesperson and was known as their encourager. A native of Asheville, North Carolina, Kathy has a heart for volunteering for Buncombe County community organizations, standing in the gap in a way that makes a difference. She is a member of Merrimon Avenue Baptist Church and has served over the years as a Sunday School teacher, Vacation Bible School volunteer, and director of Mothers’ Day Out; she has also been active in support groups.
