

THE COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The line of march for the procession follows academic protocol and historical tradition. At today's ceremony, the academic procession begins with the commencement marshal carrying the College banner and with the longest-serving faculty member bearing the mace. Proceeding next are the candidates for graduation, and then the members of the faculty, and the President's Cabinet. At the end of the processional is the platform party, including the chairman of the Board of Trustees, honored guests, invited speakers, and the president who presides over the ceremony. The line of march is reversed for the recessional.

THE COLLEGE SEAL

The seal of Montreat College is composed of concentric circles surrounding the open book of learning and the Word of God. The words "Montreat College" encompass the ideals of strength, beauty, and truth above the Latin motto meaning "to be rather than to seem." The date of the founding of the College, 1916, completes the emblem.

THE MACE AND THE BANNER

Designed and created by Art Professor Emeritus James D. Southerland, M.F.A., Artist-in-Residence

The College mace symbolizes the authority of the president and is present in all official College ceremonies. The Montreat mace is of walnut and silver representing the simplicity and strength of the Cross of Christ, the open Bible, and the lamp of knowledge, transcendent over the seal of the College. The College banner features an arched window opening onto the mountains, framing heaven and the College's Christ-centered education; the globe atop represents the worldwide scope provided by education and the development of a Christian worldview based upon the Bible's teaching. The books represent the beauty and strength of scholarship and the variety of disciplines offered by the College. The candle embodies the illumination that education and faith bring to the individual and the world.

THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic regalia worn by the faculty are based upon costumes used in fourteenth and fifteenth century universities, particularly Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England. This style of academic dress has been used in the United States since colonial times, and it was standardized by an intercollegiate code in 1895. The doctoral gown is distinguished by three velvet stripes on the bell-shaped sleeves, while the master gown's sleeves are oblong. The hood was originally a practical element of dress, but it evolved into a purely ornamental article, draped over the shoulder and down the back. The doctoral hood extends longer than the master hood. The two colors in the satin lining of the hood are those authorized by the college or university, and the color of the velvet border indicates the degree earned as follows:

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Dr. Kenneth Boa

Dr. Kenneth "Ken" Boa is engaged in a life-ministry of relational evangelism and discipleship, teaching, writing, and speaking. He holds a bachelor of science degree from Case Institute of Technology, a master of theology degree from Dallas Theological Seminary, a doctorate from New York University, and a doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Oxford in England.

Dr. Boa is the president of Reflections Ministries, an organization that seeks to encourage, teach, and equip people to know Christ, follow Him, become progressively conformed to His image, and reproduce His life in others. He is also the president of Trinity House Publishers, a publishing company that is dedicated to the creation of tools that will help people manifest eternal values in a temporal arena by drawing them into intimacy with God through a better understanding of the culture in which they live each day.

Some of Dr. Boa's recent publications include Conformed to His Image, 20 Compelling Evidences that God Exists, Face to Face-Volumes 1 and 2, Augustine to Freud, and Faith Has its Reasons.

He is also a contributing editor to *The Open Bible* and *The Leadership Bible*, and the consulting editor of the *Zondervan NASB Study Bible*.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Dr. Donald R. Mitchell

Awarded posthumously Received by his wife, Mrs. Grace Mitchell

Dr. Donald R. Mitchell was born and educated in New Zealand where he taught school until moving to Lima, Peru. There he worked at St. Andrews College for nine years. He earned his doctorate from Princeton Theological Seminary in New Jersey, then served as dean at Montreat College in North Carolina, vice president of Wheaton College in Illinois, and president of King College in Bristol, Tennessee. After retirement from King College in 1989, he served as an interim minister for ten Presbyterian and Baptist Churches in Kings Mountain, Gastonia, Charlotte, and Monroe.

Dr. Mitchell was a lifelong student, scholar, and champion of Christian higher education. Under his leadership as dean of Montreat College, the Board of Trustees made a deliberate decision to affirm its commitment to biblical truth and to the promotion of the integration of faith and learning in the classroom. A former student writes, that Dr. Mitchell was a mentor, who, with his wife, Grace, opened their home and hearts to shelter, encourage, and support students. Dr. Mitchell led with wisdom, humility, and above all, a compassionate example. Many enjoyed his lively mind, quick wit, and gentle spirit. He was loved as a preacher, a pastor to all, a strong administrator, and a generous friend.

On May 28, 2011, Dr. Mitchell, age 85, passed away of bone cancer. He is survived by his wife, Grace, two daughters, Marion, of Black Mountain, and Alison Camponi (Montreat alum), a son-in-law, and grandson, all of Salisbury, North Carolina.
