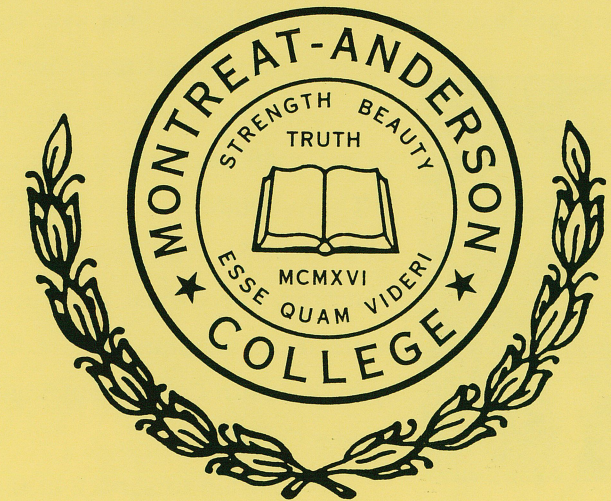

Convocation Speaker

John William (Jack) Lancaster, Pastor Emeritus of the First Presbyterian Church of Houston, Texas, is the 1994 Spring Honors Convocation speaker.

Dr. Lancaster graduated from Austin College in Sherman, Texas. He continued his education at Union Theological Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. He then attended Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, receiving a M.Th. In addition to his formal studies, he has studied at St. Andrews in Scotland, and at Princeton Theological Seminary. He has been awarded the honorary doctor of divinity degree by both Austin College and Southwestern (now Rhodes College).



In addition to service in the United States Submarine Service, Dr. Lancaster has an impressive list of service as a pastor. He served the First Presbyterian Church in Bay City, TX and then the First Presbyterian Church in Houston, from 1961 to 1990. He is currently interim pastor at the First Presbyterian Church in Columbus, GA.

Dr. Lancaster is a board member of the Outreach Foundation of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) He has served as chairman of the Board of Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary; chairman of the board of the Presbyterian Survey newsletter; and moderator of the synod of Texas, to name a few. Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary established the John Wm. and Helen Lancaster Chair of Evangelism and Mission in 1990. He and his wife Helen have four daughters and four grandchildren. The Lancasters are Montreat Cottagers. Helen currently serves as a M-AC Trustee.

Special Music

Michael S. Ballard presents the special music for the 1994 Spring Honors Convocation service. Ballard, a native of North Carolina and resident of Black Mountain, continues to pursue a full time operatic career. He received a B.M. in voice performance from Indiana University in 1980. He has performed in operatic roles across the country, ranging from New York's Metropolitan Opera in to the Gilbert and Sullivan Society of San Jose. He is considered a major vocal talent by Ed Purrington of Washington Opera in Washington, D.C.

Departmental & Special Awards

The Elizabeth H. Maxwell Literature Award
Established in 1992 in honor of Elizabeth Maxwell, professor emeritus. May be given to a graduating senior who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in literary studies as determined by the English faculty. The student must have demonstrated creativity and maturity in the field of literary studies.

The Christian Education Scholastic Achievement Award
Given by the North American Association of Professors of Christian Education upon the recommendation of the Christian Ministries Division to a student who has distinguished herself academically and has potential for making a significant contribution to the field of Christian Education.

The Greybeard Players Theatrical Excellence Award
This award is available to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have documented financial need and who have demonstrated excellence and potential in the field of theatrical arts through exemplary participation in the work of the Greybeard Players.

The Music Award
Established in 1990 to recognize the graduating senior(s) who have contributed most to the music program, both academic and extracurricular music classes and activities.

The SGA Person of the Year Award
This award is given each year to an individual who has excelled in all areas of the college through the eyes of the Student Government Association. The SGA nominates several individuals and votes for one by secret ballot.

The SGA Excellence Award
This award is given to the member of the SGA who has shown outstanding dedication and leadership throughout the year. Established this year, the honoree will be selected annually by a majority vote of the legislative committee.

The Servant Leader Award
New this year is the Kim Trapnell Servant Leader Award. This award is presented annually to the student who best demonstrates a servant's heart in leading others through service, attitude and relationships. The award is named in honor of Kim Trapnell, an outstanding example of servant leadership.

The Faculty Service Award
The faculty annually recognizes a graduating senior who has made outstanding contributions to the college and who gives evidence of effective Christian citizenship.

The David L. Parks Distinguished Professor Award
Established in 1991-92 by the Board of Trustees in honor of Dr. Parks' many years of faithful service to the college. This award, previously entitled, "Teacher of the Year Award," is chosen by colleagues of the recipient using the criteria of creative and effective teaching, scholarship, personal and professional integrity, and commitment to the stated purpose of the college.
