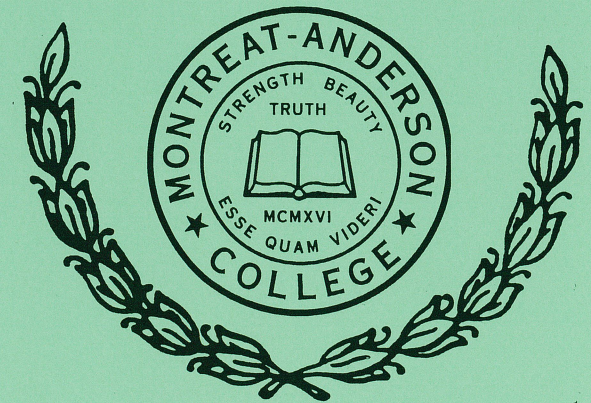

1995 SPRING HONORS CONVOCATION



Montreat-Anderson College

Convocation Speaker

Albert G. (Pete) Peery, Jr., newly appointed pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Asheville, is the 1995 Spring Honors Convocation speaker.



Of his personal spiritual journey, Dr. Peery quotes Horace Bushnell who said, “The goal of Christian nurture is to rear a child in such a way that the child will never know what it is like not to be a Christian.” Dr.Peery says, “In a deep sense, my life may be summed up as one who has been blessed with such nurture and thus who has always known I am a part of the family of God formed and claimed by Jesus the Christ.”

Dr. Perry describes his nurturing as beginning with the gift of birth into a family deeply grounded in the faith—his mother was reared as a missionary child in China, and then became a Christian educator; his father, an elder in his Presbyterian church, was a lawyer and a judge who considered his legal work and his involvement in the life and politics of Virginia a Christian calling.

The Church was always home for him as he attended events at the Tazewell Presbyterian Church in Tazewell, VA, including youth camps and conferences; then to St. Andrews Presbyterian College where he questioned the legitimacy of the Church and the faith and yet was allowed to do that while being nurtured and accepted by faculty and mentors who were the embodiment of that church college; to Union Theological Seminary where he truly experienced the excitement of biblical study and the confirmation of call to pastoral ministry; and to his almost twenty years of ministry to God’s people both in this country and abroad. In these regards, the Church has been his home.

Dr. Peery’s spiritual nurturing continued with his marriage to Margaret Barnes Peery, also an ordained Presbyterian minister, and his partner in life and in the gospel ministry. They have been blessed with two children, Pen and Meg, both in high school, who fill their lives with joy, struggle and wonder.

Upon graduation from seminary, Dr. Peery’s spiritual journey led him to become Associate Pastor of the Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church of Stone Mountain, Georgia. In 1976 he and Mrs. Peery became Associate Pastors of the Myers Park Presbyterian Church in Charlotte. During this time they traveled extensively visiting churches in Europe, Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean. In 1984, the Peerys left their Charlotte church to begin a new ministry as Peace Associates for the Presbyterian Church (USA) in Europe, based in London.

After returning to this country, Dr. Peery became a New Church Developer in the Mecklenburg Presbytery, a result of which was the organization of the MorningStar Presbyterian Church in Matthews where Dr. Peery became pastor. In addition to his pastorate, he has served as Moderator of the Presbytery, chair of the Finance Committee, and as co-chair of the Task Force on the Mission and Function of Presbytery. Mrs. Peery has served as Vice Moderator of the General Assembly of the PCUSA, and as a pastoral counselor in Charlotte.

Dr. Peery’s spiritual journey now continues through his ministry at the First Presbyterian Church in Asheville. It is our privilege to welcome him to the Montreat community.

The Elizabeth H. Maxwell Literature Award
Established in 1992 in honor of Elizabeth Maxwell, professor emeritus. May be given to a graduating senior who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in literary studies as determined by the English faculty. The student must have demonstrated creativity and maturity in the field of literary studies.

The Greybeard Players Theatrical Excellence Award
Available to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have documented financial need and who have demonstrated excellence and potential in the field of theatrical arts through exemplary participation in the work of the Greybeard Players.

The Music Award
Established in 1990 to recognize the graduating senior(s) who has contributed most to the music program, in both academic and extracurricular music classes and activities.

The History Award
May be given to a graduating senior deemed especially outstanding as a student of history. The recipient is usually but not limited to a history major or minor.

The SGA Person of the Year Award
Given annually by the Student Government Association to an individual who has excelled in all areas of the college.

The SGA Excellence Award
Established in 1994 by the SGA Legislative Committee. Given annually to the member of the Student Government Association who has shown outstanding dedication and leadership throughout the year.

The Kim Denise Trapnell Servant Leader Award
Established in 1994 in honor of Kim Denise Trapnell, an outstanding example of student leadership. Given annually to the student who best demonstrates a servant’s heart in leading others through service, attitude and relationships.

Who’s Who Among Students in American Universities & Colleges
Members are selected for this national organization as outstanding campus leaders according to scholarship ability, participation and leadership in academic and extracurricular activities, citizenship and service to the school, and potential for future achievement.

The Faculty Service Award
The faculty annually recognizes a graduating senior who has made outstanding contributions to the college and who gives evidence of effective Christian citizenship.

The David L. Parks Distinguished Professor Award
Established in 1992 by the Board of Trustees in honor of Dr. David Parks’ many years of faithful service to the college. This award is chosen by the faculty using the criteria of creative and effective teaching, scholarship, personal and professional integrity, and commitment to the stated purpose of the college.
