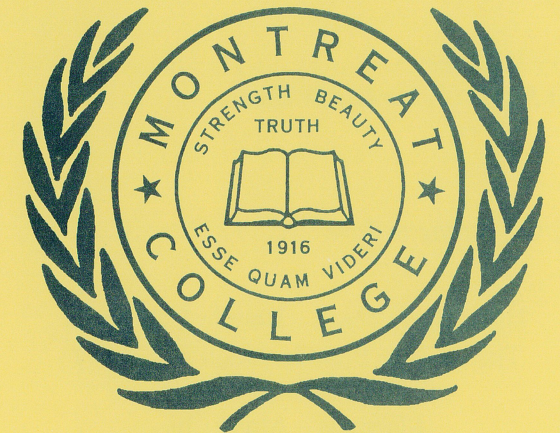

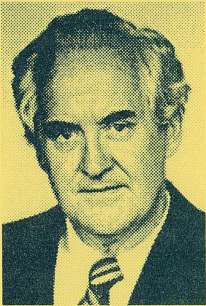

Convocation Speaker



Dr. J. Randolph Taylor of Black Mountain is the president emeritus of San Francisco Theological Seminary, San Anselmo, CA, where he served as president from 1985-94. Prior to that post, he was pastor at Myers Park Presbyterian Church in Charlotte from 1976-85, and also served as pastor of Central Presbyterian Church in Atlanta and The Church of the Pilgrims in Washington, D.C.

The son of missionary parents, Dr. Taylor was born in Taichow, Kiangsu province, China. He is a graduate of Davidson College, where he earned an A.B. degree and was president of the student body. Dr. Taylor received his B.D. degree from Union Theological Seminary in Richmond, VA, where he was also president of the student body, and his Ph.D. from the University of Aberdeen, Scotland.

He has been active in many community projects, including chairing the Community Relations Committee in Charlotte and serving as commissioner for the Housing Authority of Charlotte.

He was elected first Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in 1983. He and his wife, Arline, have represented the Presbyterian Church overseas on many occasions. Dr. and Mrs. Taylor have six children and ten grandchildren.

Departmental & Special Awards

The Greybeard Players Theatrical Excellence Award
Available to sophomores, juniors and seniors who have documented financial need and who have demonstrated excellence and potential in the field of theatrical arts through exemplary participation in the work of the Greybeard Players.

The Music Award
Established in 1990 to recognize the graduating senior(s) who has contributed most to the music program, in both academic and extracurricular music classes and activities.

The American Bible Society Scholastic Achievement Award
Presented by the American Bible Society upon recommendation of the Christian Ministries Division to a student who has excelled academically and has potential for making a significant contribution in the field of Biblical studies.

The Environmental Studies Award
Awarded annually to graduating seniors within the Environmental Studies program. Award recipients are chosen by the Environmental Studies faculty based on academic achievement, Christian commitment, servant leadership, and leadership among students.

The SGA Person of the Year Award
Given annually by the Student Government Association to an individual who has excelled in all areas of the college.

The SGA Excellence Award
Established in 1994 by the SGA Legislative Committee. Given annually to the member of the Student Government Association who has shown outstanding dedication and leadership throughout the year.

The Kim Denise Trapnell Servant Leader Award
Established in 1994 in honor of Kim Denise Trapnell, an outstanding example of student leadership. Given annually to the student who best demonstrates a servant’s heart in leading others through service, attitude and relationships.

Who’s Who Among Students in American Universities & Colleges
Members are selected for this national organization as outstanding campus leaders according to scholarship ability, participation and leadership in academic and extracurricular activities, citizenship and service to the school, and potential for future achievement.

The Faculty Service Award
The faculty annually recognizes a graduating senior who has made outstanding contributions to the college and who gives evidence of effective Christian citizenship.

The David L. Parks Distinguished Professor Award
Established in 1992 by the Board of Trustees in honor of Dr. David Parks’ many years of faithful service to the college. This award is chosen by the faculty using the criteria of creative and effective teaching, scholarship, personal and professional integrity, and commitment to the stated purpose of the college.
