

**The Hicks Anderson Outstanding Business Student Award**  
Established in 2001 to recognize a graduating Business major who has best demonstrated outstanding academic performance, selfless service, and exemplary Christian character. This award is presented annually to one School of Arts and Sciences student and one School of Professional and Adult Studies student.

**The Dale H. Britton Academic Writing Award**  
The Dale H. Britton Academic Writing Award may be presented annually on a competitive basis to a student who exhibits excellence in expository writing. The award is named in honor of Professor Britton's dedication to the development of students' effective written communication and is sponsored by the Writing Center.

**The Greybeard Players Theatrical Excellence Award**  
This award is available to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have documented financial need and who have demonstrated excellence and potential in the field of theatrical arts through exemplary participation in the work of the Greybeard Players.

**The Lillie Sears Foster Award**  
The Lillie Sears Foster Award honors the memory of a preschool student taught by Montreat alumna Angie Sorenson. Angie and her husband have established this scholarship to assist Greybeard Players with demonstrated financial need and academic potential.

**The Outdoor Education Award**  
Given to a graduating senior deemed especially outstanding, who is a candidate for a bachelor of science degree in Outdoor Education. Requirements include that the student is committed to a career in Outdoor Education, maintains a GPA of 3.0, has taken advantage of certification programs offered during their tenure, has made an outstanding contribution to the OE department, has demonstrated creativity, maturity and excellence in teaching in the field of Outdoor Education, demonstrates he/she is a servant leader, and bears evidence of a committed Christian Life.

**The Kim Denise Trapnell Servant Leader Award**  
Established in 1994 in honor of Kim Denise Trapnell, an outstanding example of student leadership. Given annually to the student who best demonstrates a servant's heart in leading other through service, attitude and relationships.

**The NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete Award**  
This Award recognizes excellence in the classroom and on the field of play. Nominees for this honor must be junior or senior varsity performers who have been enrolled at their nominating institution for a minimum of one full term. They must also maintain a GPA of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale from their nominating institution.

**Who's Who Among Students in American Universities & Colleges**  
Members are selected for this national organization as outstanding campus leaders according to scholarship ability, participation and leadership in academic and extracurricular activities, citizenship and service to the school, and potential for future achievement.

**The Faculty Service Award**  
The faculty annually recognizes a graduating senior who has made outstanding contributions to the college and who gives evidence of effective Christian citizenship.

**The David L. Parks Distinguished Professor Award**  
Established in 1992 by the Board of Trustees in honor of Dr. David Parks' many years of faithful service to the college. This award is chosen by the faculty using the criteria of creative and effective teaching, scholarship, personal and professional integrity, and commitment to the mission of the college.

# CONVOCATION SPEAKER

Dr. R. Bradley Daniel joined the faculty of Montreat College in 1984. Since then he has become teacher, encourager, counselor, friend, and mentor to Montreat students. Brad Daniel has been a true example of servant leadership on the Montreat campus and has impacted the lives of his students through his personal and effective teaching style.

When asked about his teaching philosophy, Dr. Daniel said, “Teaching is the art and craft of engaging the heart and mind in order to encourage the realization of God-given potential. It extends beyond facts and figures. It involves more than mastery of content. It is the act of investing one’s life in others in order to encourage their mental, emotional, social, and spiritual growth.”

Born in Brevard, North Carolina, Dr. Daniel holds a bachelors degree in biology/experiential education and a masters degree in biology with an emphasis in ecology and environmental science from Appalachian State University. He holds a second masters degree in outdoor education from Northern Illinois University and a Ph.D. in environmental studies from Antioch University’s New England Graduate School. He has done additional graduate study at the University of Alaska at Anchorage and is currently working on a third master’s degree at the University of North Carolina at Asheville in liberal arts.

In addition to being a member of the Montreat College faculty, Dr. Daniel is a certified instructor for the Wilderness Education Association (WEA), a certified North Carolina State Environmental Educator, and a certified Search and Rescue Technician. He is also an adjunct faculty member at Antioch University’s New England Graduate School.
