

The Montreat College Theatrical Excellence Award
This award is available to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have demonstrated excellence and potential in the field of theatrical arts through exemplary participation in theatre work at the college.

The Lillie Sears Foster Award
The Lillie Sears Foster Award honors the memory of a preschool student taught by Montreat alumna Angie Sorenson. Angie and her husband have established this scholarship to assist Montreat theatre minors with demonstrated financial need and academic potential.

Senior Music Award
The Senior Music Major Award may be presented annually to a graduating music major who exhibits excellence in music, and who has made significant contributions in service to the music program.

The Human Services Award
Awarded annually to a graduating senior within the Human Services program. Using the following criteria, the award recipient is chosen collaboratively by the Human Services faculty and graduating seniors within the major: abides by high moral standards, has a clear sense of direction, helps people on and off campus, and performs academic work with excellence and enthusiasm.

The Environmental Studies Award
Awarded annually to graduating seniors within the Environmental Studies program. Award recipients are chosen by the Environmental Studies faculty based on academic achievement, Christian commitment, servant leadership, and leadership among students.

The Outdoor Education Award
Given to a graduating senior deemed especially outstanding, who is a candidate for a bachelor of science degree in Outdoor Education. Requirements include that the student is committed to a career in Outdoor Education, maintains a GPA of 3.0, has taken advantage of certification programs offered during their tenure, has made an outstanding contribution to the OE department, has demonstrated creativity, maturity and excellence in teaching in the field of Outdoor Education, demonstrates he/she is a servant leader, and bears evidence of a committed Christian life.

The NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete Award
This Award recognizes excellence in the classroom and on the field of play. Nominees for this honor must be junior or senior varsity performers who have been enrolled at their nominating institution for a minimum of one full term. They must also maintain a GPA of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale from their nominating institution.

The BRIDGE Person of the Year Award is given annually by the Student Government Association to an individual who has excelled in all areas of the college.

The BRIDGE Excellence Award, established in 1994 by the Legislative Committee, is given annually to the member of the BRIDGE who has shown outstanding dedication and leadership throughout the year.

The Kim Denise Trapnell Servant Leader Award
Established in 1994 in honor of Kim Denise Trapnell, an outstanding example of student leadership. Given annually to the student who best demonstrates a servant’s heart in leading others through service, attitude and relationships.

The Faculty Service Award
The faculty annually recognizes a graduating senior who has made outstanding contributions to the college and who gives evidence of effective Christian citizenship.

The David L. Parks Distinguished Professor Award
Established in 1992 by the Board of Trustees in honor of Dr. David Parks’ many years of faithful service to the college. This award is chosen by the faculty using the criteria of creative and effective teaching, scholarship, personal and professional integrity, and commitment to the mission of the college.

Eunice Wonderly Stackhouse, Associate Professor of Music, has taught at Montreat College since 1996 and also served as Fine Arts Chair and Director of Music Programs from 2001-2005. She holds degrees from Grace College (B.M.E., *summa cum laude*), Indiana University (M.M. *with high distinction*), and the University of Kansas (D.M.A., *with honors*). She was elected to a lifetime membership in Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society by the Indiana University chapter. She also belongs to the College Music Society, and is a state officer for the Music Teachers' National Association. Dr Stackhouse has performed extensively in both solo and chamber settings, and some of her recitals have been broadcast by NPR stations in Kansas and Pennsylvania. She has adjudicated for numerous organizations, and has presented lecture-recitals at several universities and conferences across the country. Her article on the music of Louise Talma was published in the November 2002 issue of *Clavier*, and she edited the first publication of Talma's *Three Bagatelles* in 2003 for Hildegard Pub. Co. Dr. Stackhouse has been included in recent editions of *Marquis' Who's Who in America*, *Who's Who of American Women*, and *Who's Who Among America's Teachers*, and was the recipient of the David L. Parks Distinguished Professor Award at Montreat College in May 2006.

THE AWARDS

The Outstanding Christian Educator Award
The Outstanding Christian Educator Award is given by the North American Association of Christian Educators upon the recommendation of the Christian Education faculty to a student who will make a significant contribution to the Christian education vocation.

The Certificate of Excellence in Youth Ministry Award
The Certificate of Excellence in Youth Ministry is awarded by the Youth Ministry Educators' Forum upon the recommendation of the Youth Ministry faculty to a student who has demonstrated academic excellence and giftedness in working with young people during college.

Zondervan Greek Award
Upon recommendation of the Biblical, Religious, and Interdisciplinary Studies Department, this award recognizes students for their singular achievement in the study of Biblical Greek. The award is presented by Zondervan Publishing House.

The Hicks Anderson Outstanding Business Student Award
Established in 2001 to recognize a graduating Business major who has best demonstrated outstanding academic performance, selfless service, and exemplary Christian character. This award is presented annually to one School of Arts and Sciences student and one School of Professional and Adult Studies student.

The Elizabeth Maxwell Literature Award
Given to a graduating senior who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in literary studies as determined by the English faculty. Requirements include that the student major in English, maintain a GPA of 3.2, take at least one course from each full-time member of the English faculty, and demonstrate creativity and maturity in the field of literary studies.
