



Directed Study and Research (F242)

A directed study is a customized program of study in a student's major or minor in which the student undertakes intensive work in an approved subject. Designed in collaboration with a faculty member, the directed study is intended either to be an extension of a previous course or the study of a topic not included in the curriculum. It may include such options as research, project development, readings, or performance.

Qualifications include:

- Junior standing or above -Grade point average of at least 2.5
- Completion of all prerequisites stated in each department's directed study course description
- Receive all approvals on this form at least 3 weeks before the start of the semester in which the course will be taken

Fee/Tuition Charges:

- Fall, Spring semesters: a per-credit-hour fee is charged in addition to tuition (as outlined in the current Academic Catalog).
- Summer sessions: the per-credit-hour tuition is charged (as outlined in the current Academic Catalog).

Directed study courses may not be taken in lieu of courses offered by the College. Directed Studies must be taken during the semester in which the credit is awarded.
