### 3 BCSD Course Additions:

#### **BCSD 2190      SLPA Fieldwork I**

This course provides structured supervised observation and administrative preparation for students enrolled in the Associate of Science in Communication Sciences and Disorders program who require continuation of fieldwork during program transition. Students will complete observation of speech-language pathology and/or audiology services, documentation activities, and administrative support tasks under approved supervision. Emphasis is placed on professional conduct, clinical documentation, and preparation for SLPA clinical practicum. This course does not authorize independent clinical practice and is completed under faculty oversight. (3 credits)

#### **BCSD 2191      SLPA Fieldwork II**

This course provides supervised SLPA clinical experience for students enrolled in the Associate of Science in Communication Sciences and Disorders program who require continuation of fieldwork during program transition. Students will complete supervised clinical activities under the direction of a licensed Speech-Language Pathologist consistent with SLPA scope of practice. Activities include implementation of intervention plans, data collection, documentation, and professional reflection. All clinical activities must occur under approved supervision and in accordance with applicable state regulations. (3 credits)

#### **BCSD 2250      Communication Disorders in Diverse Populations**

This course examines communication disorders across culturally and linguistically diverse populations. Students explore how culture, language, and socioeconomic factors influence the identification, assessment, and intervention of speech and language disorders. Emphasis is placed on culturally responsive and ethical practices, reducing bias, and distinguishing between communication differences and disorders to support equitable, family-centered care. (3 credits)

### 1 MSCP Course Addition:

#### **MSCP 5224      Integrated Behavioral Health and Medical Family Therapy**

Provides students with an introduction to medical family therapy and integrated behavioral healthcare. Topics include the biopsychosocial-spiritual approach, primary care, and approaching specific illnesses from a MedFT perspective. Students will have the opportunity to explore the relationship between physiological conditions and mental health symptoms in an integrated clinical environment. Focus will also be given on the importance of collaboration between healthcare professionals and a systemic approach to medical treatment. (3 credits)
